

## RAMBLINGS ABOUT ‘REASON’

Over the past few years, I have jotted down *some rants*, as some people might call them, over ideas, philosophies and statements that we encounter that seem to be void of reason, not passing the logic test by any means.

Having been at this paper now for over 43 years, permit me some ramblings---

What really is with the folks who claim to be Christian ministers and actually go through the motions of worship and study, yet will wholeheartedly agree with the doctrine of tolerance that there are many paths to God and one religion is just as valid in truth as the other? Did they never hear the words of Jesus...no man comes to God except through me. Do they not read the claims of Jesus, and hear the words of Scripture that there is no other name by which we are saved? It is unreasonable to claim Christianity and concede that all religious teaching is still valid. By the same token many of these well-heeled Christian thinkers try to liberalize Jesus' life and doctrine... he was a great moral leader, a good teacher, but his resurrection is merely figurative, the miracles didn't happen. Sorry, can't be..those folk definitely flunked logic class. As C. S. Lewis said, Jesus is either liar, lunatic or Lord of all..there is no logical middle ground or compromise. He is the only way or He is no way. You must make your choice.

Many Christian groups are in a similar way guilty of unreasonable faith when they want to base it purely on personal whims or feelings, not grounded in any authority or revelation from God. If we want to live moral lives there must be a moral compass. Is that up to each individual or is there a standard? Logically, of course, there must be a standard and as Christians we follow Scripture. Abandon that and you have ethical anarchy, everyone rules. If you believe in God, he is the one who has the right to make the rules.

That is no more evident than in the idea of accepting homosexual activity as an approved lifestyle. Did anyone ever dream that a sexual practice of maybe 5% of the population would become a “community” with political power. What next, a community and lobby for sexual sadists? To say anyone is free to “marry” whoever they want, is so against nature,(memo –male was made for female and visa versa) logic and reason. What then hinders us from allowing polygamy, or child marriage? The most ridiculous abuse of reason are those who try to say the Bible does not condemn homosexuality!

They worshipped regularly with prayer, teaching, breaking of bread and fellowship. They helped those in need as evidenced by the statement that no one had needs that weren't cared for, even deacons appointed to make sure the distribution was fair. Then their third concern was world evangelism, to go everywhere preaching the good news to all nations. We, by and large, follow that trinity of purpose, but are not all equal in importance? Worship, Benevolence, Evangelism? Then why do churches spend the vast majority of their budgets, time and resources on Worship, giving scant concern to helping the needy or world missions? Logical? It is precisely why Christians have lost ground in winning the hearts of minds of the world. Worship without the other makes for a self-centered religion.
